Michigan Adoption Resource Exchange (MARE) and Michigan Department Of Health and Human Services are honoring 30 exceptional adoptive families in November 2017 as part of the celebrations for National Adoption Month. Each of the highlighted families will be granted a wish to benefit their family.

### **What is National Adoption Month**

According to the Children's Bureau, National Adoption Month is an initiative of the Children's Bureau with a goal to increase national awareness and bring attention to the need for permanent families for children and youth in the U.S. foster care system.

Every year, there is an initiative that focuses its "outreach and awareness-raising" efforts around a new adoption-related theme. This year's theme for National Adoption Month is "Teens Need Families, No Matter What". For the past two years, the initiative for National Adoption Month has focused on the importance of adopting teens to raise awareness due to the urgent need of committed families for the thousands of teenagers currently in foster care. Unfortunately, teens are often less likely to be adopted due to their age and frequently age out of the system without a stable support system. It is critical we continue to do all we can to raise awareness for permanent families for teens. As the 2016 theme stated, "We never outgrow the need for family."

#### A Bit of History on National Adoption Month

- 1976, Massachusetts Governor Michael Dukakis announced an Adoption Week to promote awareness of the need for adoptive families for children in foster care.
- 1984 President Reagan proclaimed the first National Adoption Week.
- 1995 President Clinton expanded the awareness week to the entire month of November.
- 1998 President Clinton directed the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to develop a plan to expand the use of the Internet as a tool to find homes for children waiting to be adopted from foster care.
- 2008 President Bush provided an explanation of National Adoption Month in Spanish.
